SO NICE TO "MEET" YOU









WHY WE ARE adopting


MEET Shane


I grew up in Colorado and spent most of my summers as a kid playing at an area we dubbed "Andy's Fort." These days, I still walk the dog in the area I grew up in!




eric in shane's words








ERIC'S FAMILY:


